2. Samples of the treated product shall be taken monthly from a sampling point after the pasteurisation phase during or after storage and tested for *Salmonella* and *Escherichia* or Enterococaceae.

Annex

1. The animal by-products including catering waste must be reduced in size to a particle size of no more than 12mm using maserators and treated in the pasteuriser in such a way that the animal by-products including catering waste achieve at least 70°C for at least 60 minutes.

Notes

1. Processed (rendered) material derived from Category 1 material may not be treated in a composting or biogas plant. If other processed material is treated in a composting or biogas plant, it must have been produced by –
 - (a) processing Category 2 animal by-products by method 1 in an approved processing plant;
 - (b) processing Category 3 animal by-products by one of methods 1-7 in an approved processing plant.
