Annex

1. The catering waste must be reduced in size to a particle size of no more than 400mm using a macerator / shredder and treated in a closed reactor in such a way that the catering waste achieve at least 60 degrees Centigrade for at least 48 hours. The material shall be turned once using a mechanical shovel , and re treated again at at least 60 degrees Centigrade for a further 48 hours.
2. Following treatment in accordance with paragraph 1, the material shall be stored in open windrows for at least 18 days

Notes

1. Processed (rendered) material derived from Category 1 material may not be treated in a composting or biogas plant. If other processed material is treated in a composting or biogas plant, it must have been produced by –
 - (a) processing Category 2 animal by-products by method 1 in an approved processing plant;
 - (b) processing Category 3 animal by-products by one of methods 1-7 in an approved processing plant.
